

## SMART BOARD FOR TAFELBERG

The Tafelberg School in Bothasig recently received a new interactive white board which will assist teachers and enthrall learners.

The R24 000 white board came about through the efforts of one of the parents, Mrs Kerr, when she approached the Dischem Foundation who in turn brought 94.5 KFM on board through their "random acts of kindness" initiative.

The computerized board is an intelligent teaching tool.
